Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." Leader 2: Blessed Wisdom, whose cry is to all that live, inspire us as we pray for healing and the relief of those in any trouble or adversity.

Leader 1: Hagia Sophia, whose root is the awe of God and whose branches are long life, instruct us as we pray for all other concerns of this community.

Leader 2: Holy Wisdom who has led the saints by a marvelous way, assist us as we pray for those who have died and all who mourn, that we may hope in the midst of sorrow and rejoice in the midst of loss.

Officiant: Holy Wisdom, in your loving kindness you created and restored us when we were lost: inspire us with your truth, that we may love you with our whole minds and run to you with open hearts through Christ our Savior. **Amen.**
