Pastoral Care at St. George's is a ministry of the clergy and the laity. By walking with each other through times of joy and times of sorrow, the love of Christ is revealed.

Leader 2: We pray especially for our Diocese, St. George's, and Notre Dame Parish and School in Port au Prince.

Leader 1: You have opened heaven's gate! Inspire all ministers who witness to your glory on earth.

Leader 2: We pray especially for our lay and clergy leaders and for those newly baptized into our ministry in Christ.

Leader 1: Jesus burst his three days' prison! Help us proclaim release to all in captivity, freedom to all oppressed, food for those who hunger, and safety to those who fear.

Leader 1: Death is conquered and we are free! Let your will for all who have died be fulfilled, and may we rise with them in glory.

Leader 2: We pray especially for those close to us whom we love but see no longer.

Officiant: Grant, we pray, Almighty God, that we who celebrate with awe the Paschal feast may be found worthy to attain to everlasting joys. Accept the prayers of your people and breathe new life into us as we seek to do your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

It is the joy of our salvation, God of the universe, to give you thanks through Jesus Christ. You said, 'Let there be light'; there was light. Your light shines on in our darkness. For you the earth has brought forth life in all its forms. You have created us to hear your Word. to do your will and to be fulfilled in your love. It is right to thank you.

**You sent your Son to be for us the way we need to follow and the truth we need to know.**

You raised him to life triumphant over death; you exalted him in glory. By his victory over death, the reign of sin has ended.

**A new age has dawned, a broken world is restored and we are made whole once more.**

You send your Holy Spirit to strengthen and to guide, to warn and to revive your Church. Therefore, with all your witnesses who surround us on every side, countless as heaven's stars, we praise you for our creation and our calling, with loving and with joyful hearts:

Send your Holy Spirit, that we who receive Christ's body may indeed be the body of Christ, and we who share his cup draw strength from the one true vine.

Celebrant: This is the table, not simply of the church, but of Christ our savior. It is made ready for those who love Christ and those who want to love more. So come, you who have much faith and you who have little, you who have been here often and you who have not been here long, you who have tried to follow and you who have failed. Come, because it is Christ who invites you. It is God's will that those who wish should meet the love of Christ here.

*All are welcome to participate in Communion, either by receiving the Sacrament or receiving a blessing. Communion is the sacramental body and blood of Jesus Christ received in bread and wine blessed by the Holy Spirit.*

- *Proceed forward toward the communion ministers when prompted (notify an usher if you need to receive at your seat).*
  - *To receive the bread, hold your hands out, palms up.*
  - *To receive the wine, sip from the cup (a.k.a. chalice) or point to the cup for the bread to be dipped by the minister.*
  - *Gluten-free? Hold your hands palms down, then take the wafer from the separate container when offered. Ask for the gluten-free cup if preferred.*
  - *To receive a blessing (prayed by the minister), cross your arms over your chest.*
- Receiving just the bread or just the wine is a full and valid participation.*

*For more information about participation in the sacraments of Holy Communion or Holy Baptism, contact the clergy.*
